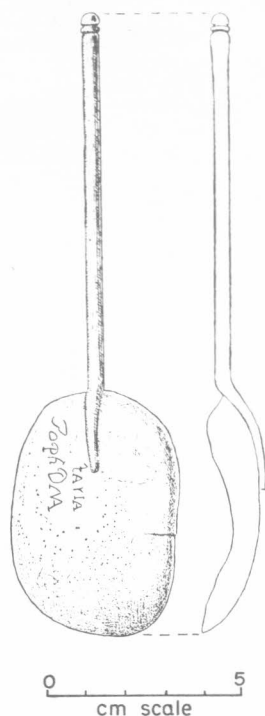


FIG. 18. Silver spoon.

- Two brass buttons, ringed, Mound C (Pl. 14i)
- Thirty-three small to medium hawk bells, Mound C (Pl. 14f, j)
- Two large sleigh bells, Mound C (Pl. 14e)
- Four brass spatulas, Mound B (Pl. 14 l, m)
- Nine pieces of brass scrap, Mound B (Pl. 13gg)
- Brass pot (Pl. 16e)

SILVER

- One silver spoon, first and second name engraved, Mound C (Fig. 18; Pl. 14p)
- Two silver sleigh bells, Mound C. One is engraved and bears letters W and I (Pl. 14d, e)

GLASS

- Fifteen glass sherds, most having been burned in a fire
- One wine bottle Mound C (Pl. 15a)¹

¹ This bottle was embedded under 5 feet of water-laid silt in the gully on the east flank of Mound C. George I.

BEADS

- Seventeen assorted spheroid and oval monochrome blue, white, and green beads, medium size, Mound B
- Two beads, polychrome blue and white stripes, medium size, Mound B
- Four seed beads, three blue, one white, Mound B
- One bead, blue, white, and red layers, large size, Mound C (Pl. 15k)
- One short string of dark amber to black, flattened, spheroidal beads, small, Mound C (Pl. 15i)
- Two short strings of colorless glazed or porcelain beads, medium size, Mound C (Pl. 15c)
- One short string of blue spheroidal beads, containing one faceted translucent and one red opaque, medium size, Mound C (Pl. 15b)
- One long string of small, colorless, flattened beads, Mound C (Pl. 15f)
- One short string of mixed blue and black spheroidal beads and one cane bead, with blue and white stripes, Mound C (Pl. 15g)
- One short string of blue spheroidal beads, one white oval and one blue-spiral-striped on white oval, medium size, Mound C
- One short string of colorless oval beads, with blue spiral stripes, large, Mound C (Pl. 15h)
- One short string of blue spheroidal beads, medium size, Mound C (Pl. 15e)
- One short string of mixed nodular and black and white striped beads, medium size, Mound C (Pl. 15j)
- One short string of medium-sized, colorless, spheroidal beads, Mound C (Pl. 15l)
- One long string of medium-sized, blue, spheroidal beads, Mound C
- Two short strings of medium-sized blue spheroidal beads, Mound C
- One long string of medium-sized blue spheroidal beads, Mound C
- One long string of small colorless spheroidal beads, Mound C
- Three short strings of small blue spheroidal beads, Mound C
- One long string of small blue beads, Mound C

Quimby dates the type at about 1760. I. Noel Hume examined it and compared it with a dated series and places it at no earlier than 1810-1860. Charles H. Fairbanks concurs with Hume's estimate (1963, personal communications).
