2-355	" "	1 drawn glass, faceted "Russian" bead, tubular cornerless hexagonal shaped, 8.25 x 8.6-8.9 mm, 5.0 mm hole, translucent blue, HBC
2-364	20-25 1/8" column	1 drawn glass bead, torus shaped, 1.85 x 3.30 mm, 1.3 mm hole, opaque "robin's egg" blue, 5 BG 5/4, HBC
5-8	0-10	1 drawn glass "seed" bead, torus shaped, 1.50 x 2.15 mm, -1.0 mm hole, opaque lt. blue, 2.5 B 5/6
5-16	10-20	1 wire wound, spherical shaped "Canton" bead, 10.1 x 11.85 mm, 2.0-2.5 mm hole, opaque off-white, early HBC
7-173	0-10	1 drawn glass "seed" bead, torus shaped, 1.2 x 2.0 mm 1.0 mm hole, opaque light blue 2.5 B 7/6 1 prosser type spherical shaped bead, 3.95 x 4.15 mm, 2.0 mm hole, opaque lt. blue 2.5 B 6/6, post-1840 1 prosser type spherical shaped bead, 3.80 x 4.50 mm, 1.4 mm hole, opaque white, post-1840

4-3	10-20	1 small fragment brown bottle glass; no diagnostics
5-13, 17	30-50	2 very small fragments clear bottle glass; possibly one beveled corner?
Materials: Ceramics		
(3)F-13	50-100	1 canning jar lid and "porcelain" seal, mark: "BOYD'S GENUINE PORCELAIN LINED CAP"; lid - alloy. Seal is actually a milky white glass called opal glass. 1900-1920
(3)F-18	50-100	1 fragment thick earthenware, undecorated white
5-10	30-40	1 basal fragment earthenware, undecorated white, cobalt tinge. Fragmentary makers mark of shield with royal coat of arms (British). Matches with double-shield mark Edward Clarke "Stone China" Burslem production 1880-1887
5-11	30-40	1 base and side fragment fluted earthenware bowl, white with cobalt tinge; probably from #10. Base diameter 3 1/2"

5-7	20-30	1 wire wound bead, spherical shaped, 8.0 x 6.0 mm, 3.2 mm hole, translucent blue
Materials: Leather		
3-42	80-90	3 leather fragments - largest is upper heel section of machine stitched work boot with folded top.
(3)F-23	Feature 3 50-100cm	approx. 45 small fragments charred leather?
