- k Iron-rimmed brass kettle, c. 1830. "HBC" stamped inside upper rim. Made in England (NHS X.73.419.33)
- l 3-1/2-point Hudson's Bay blanket, popular during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Reproduction made by original manufacturer in Oxfordshire, England (NHS X.70.341.40)
- m Twenty-three roller-printed cloth swatches, early nineteenth century. Possibly from England (NHS X.71.324.13)
- n Metal, pearl, horn and bone buttons, used for shirts, braces and dresses, nineteenth century. Made in England
- o Strand of blue, white, green and red beads, of the type distributed in Alaska in the late eighteenth century and well into the nineteenth century (Courtesy of A. Woodward)
- p Small strand of blue, red, white and black beads, late eighteenth to mid-nineteenth century. Found on site of Russian blockhouse at St. Michael, Alaska (Courtesy of A. Woodward)
- q Strand of blue glass beads, commonly referred to as Russian trade beads, probably early nineteenth century (Courtesy of A. Woodward)
- r Long strand of red, white and blue beads, 1847-67. Found at Hudson's Bay Company cemetery at Fort Yukon, Alaska (Courtesy of A. Woodward)

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
